# Making it New

It's the images. It's always the images. The great, and already much lamented John Berger, said it best. There he is, almost fifty years ago, looking straight at the camera, his authority shaded by the hint of a lisp, 'Seeing comes before words. The child looks and recognises before it can speak'. A poet, a storyteller and a maker of images (despite a brief dalliance with photography he was principally a painter) Berger knew, as he put it, that 'this relationship between what we see and what we know is never settled.' How we need him now.

Our times are defined by iPhone images made in an instant. They can be powerful things and in that, perhaps in that alone, they share something with the images presented at Photo London. Yet, to reach back again to Berger, as the works on show throughout the Fair testify again and again the very finest photography is not merely a mechanical record. The images here will move and shape us in a host of unforeseen ways. They have been painstakingly made—sometimes over days, months, or even years. They demand and deserve our attention. They are not rude interventions. The very best of them has a silent, subtle power that has the potential to enrich our lives and inspire us for years to come. And, on top of all that, they are darned good looking things.

The second edition of Photo London celebrated the city's reawakening as a global photography hub. The third builds from there. Our aim this year is to firmly establish Photo London as the unmissable global event for everyone who is intrigued by the past, present and future of photography. Through a rigorous curatorial process (lead by Philippe Garner) we have encouraged galleries to present rare historical treasures, new works by established masters as well as work by many of the brightest new stars in the photography firmament.

For the first time we have invited an independent curator, Tristan Lund, to curate a section of the Fair. The result is a much expanded Discovery section featuring an international group of young galleries (by which we mean galleries who are between one and five years old). Many of whom have bravely applied the 'less is more' mantra and have chosen to focus on one or two artists. The new, radical and cutting edge isn't confined to Discovery—many of our exhibitors present innovative, boundary shifting works that embrace moving image, sculpture and virtual reality and, as ever, there are rare and precious things from the dawn of the medium.

One Public Programme project, Mat Collishaw's *Thresholds*, neatly fuses the past with the future by way of a painstaking recreation of Henry Fox Talbot's pioneering 1839 Birmingham exhibition staged at King Edward's School. Fox Talbot's photographs are now impossible to see because at the time of the Birmingham exhibition, he had not resolved the process for fixing his prints and so they have faded with the years. Collishaw's project thrillingly re-presents them through the medium of virtual reality. Such is London's fascination with photography in all its forms that we anticipate long queues of people waiting to step back into nineteenth century Birmingham...

This fascination, this growing excitement about photography is palpable throughout the city. The talks and courses that we run between the Fairs sell out in minutes. Partners such as the Italian Cultural Institute, the Whitechapel Gallery and the ICA have helped us present a group of wonderful photographers including Josef Koudelka, Guy Tillim, Anders Petersen and Rineke Dijkstra to an enthusiastic London audience. Once again this year London will thrum with photography during the week of Photo London. The world's two great photography prizes are simultaneously in town—the Prix Pictet at the V&A and the Deutsche Börse at The Photographers Gallery. Tate Modern host Offprint and a major retrospective of Wolfgang Tillmans. Tate have also generously extended the run of *The Radical Eye:* Modernist Photography from the Sir Elton John Collection to coincide with Photo London. Our partnership with the National Portrait Gallery continues and has this year enabled us to host Newsha Tavakolian and William Klein. And away from the mighty museums there are a myriad of independent photography exhibitions and events such as: Fix at the Oxo Tower; *Icons of Time*, presented by the Horiuchi Foundation, and the off-site festival Peckham 24. So, no matter where you go in this city of images. No matter what you see. No matter what you buy at the Fair. No matter whether they start a new collection or are simply adding the latest acquisition to a lifetime's careful endeavour. No matter whether they make you laugh or cry or catch your breath in dumb surprise. The images are the thing. The pulse of Photo London. And our business with them is far from done.

Championing the estates of women artists previously not shown in the UK, Jacques has also maintained a successful 17-year representation of the Robert Mapplethorpe Foundation and remains the sole representative of the Estate in the UK. With her unique curatorial approach and seemingly uncommercial focus on unknown bodies of work by Mapplethorpe, including early Polaroids from the 70s and sculptures which were little known and previously not exhibited, Jacques has built a strong commercial market for Mapplethorpe as both an artist and photographer.

In 2016, Jacques invited Londonbased artist Juergen Teller to curate an exhibition of Mapplethorpe photographs. Teller on Mapplethorpe attracted record visitor numbers and significant coverage in local and international press. As of January 2017, Teller is represented by Alison Jacques Gallery who will support his solo presentation at Photo London as part of the Public Programme.













## A Route to the Future...

The Discovery section is at the core of Photo London's desire to push the definition of photography.

It is a dedicated space for young galleries that has doubled in size for the 2017 edition of Photo London. This exciting expansion shows a commitment by the founders, Michael Benson and Fariba Farshad, to give the best chance of success to new galleries whose programmes display vision and integrity.

I admire all of these galleries. Choosing to make your living by opening a gallery is a bold and brave move, almost as ambitious as making the decision to be an artist. Whilst there are established dealers that can sell one artwork and pay for their stand, this isn't the case here. But don't forget that this is where all galleries start out.

I anticipate, indeed I hope, that most of the artists on show here will be new names to you. If you approach the Discovery section with the following ideas in mind, I think it will make your visit more rewarding:

### Be open-minded, embrace the new

This is work of our time; it is saying something about the present whilst responding to art and ideas that precede it. Many works presented here are nonrepresentational, they are not obviously pictures of something or somebody, whilst others use photography as a tool to document and explore current social and political concerns. Don't let either of these be a reason to turn away, search for meaning in each and be a part of the present.

### Forget safe, be bold

The truth is, only a handful of art is a good financial investment, so look for work you truly love. If it speaks to you, makes you smile, contemplate, dream or feel a connection, hasn't it worked? These are young galleries exhibiting emerging artists and their prices reflect this, so this would be the time to take a risk.

### Ask questions and listen

Galleries have emerged as the conduit through which artists present their work to an audience. They are a filter and editor of the plethora of art in the world. They believe in their artists enough to exhibit them, so trust their knowledge and insights into the work and if you have a question, ask it.

The Discovery section is the place where the careers of tomorrow's great photographic artists start and the next wave of major galleries begin. I hope that it is also the place to which, in years to come, you will be able to trace the roots of your own collection.

# LUMA Foundation Supporter of the Crucible Project

In 2004, Maja Hoffmann created the LUMA Foundation in Switzerland to support the activities of independent artists and pioneers and organizations working in the visual arts, photography, publishing, documentary filmmaking and multimedia. Envisioned as a production tool for Ms. Hoffmann's multifaceted venture, the LUMA Foundation produces, supports and enables challenging art projects committed to an expansive understanding of environmental issues, human rights, education and culture.

In 2013, Ms. Hoffmann launched LUMA Arles to plan, develop, and manage the Parc des Ateliers, an expansive former industrial site located in Arles, France. Situated adjacent to the city's UNESCO World Heritage sites, the Parc des Ateliers serves as the major programmatic and cultural center for LUMA Foundation's diverse activities.

LUMA Arles is an experimental contemporary art center where artists, researchers and creators from every field collaborate with each other on multidisciplinary exhibitions and projects. Based in the Parc des Ateliers, a 6.5-hectare site formerly occupied by railroad workshops built in the 1840s, LUMA Arles includes a resource center designed by architect Frank Gehry; various industrial buildings undergoing rehabilitation by Selldorf Architects; and a public park laid out by landscape architect Bas Smets.

The Parc des Ateliers has regularly hosted exhibitions and projects each year in anticipation of the first phase opening in 2018. Throughout, Hoffmann has worked closely with the LUMA Arles core group (Tom Eccles, Liam Gillick, Hans Ulrich Obrist, Philippe Parreno and Beatrix Ruf) who present a program that occupies the site's completed venues—the Grande Halle, Forges and Mécanique Générale—on a rotating basis.

# PUBLIC PROGRAMME Hold Fast to Dreams

Scraps. Bits and pieces of dreams. Ideas form and un-form. Some half-forgotten things find different partners and coalesce into something splendid. Some take months to plan, others arise in the twinkling of an eye. Then there are the ones that got away because our stars did not align. Their time will come...

Months in the making the Public Programme is a star in our firmament. There is nothing quite like it. It began, with the support of the LUMA Foundation, as a means of helping the fledgling Fair to reach as wide an audience as possible. Yet it has quickly evolved into a programme that underscores the thinking behind the Fair.

The Public Programme has kept step with our determination to break down the tired barriers between photography and art—barriers that could easily restrict its appeal to a diminishing number of 'enthusiasts'. Thankfully photography flew that particular coop some time ago. These days it is everywhere. The great democratic art form of our times. Every museum and major gallery (whether a photography specialist or not) will stage at least one important photography show during the year. The Public Programme presents a carefully calibrated celebration of the wonderful traditions of photography while embracing the diversity, ingenuity, and breath-taking creativity that is abroad in the world of photography today.

Nowhere is this ambition more clearly articulated than in this year's exhibition programme where an exhibition to mark Magnum's seventieth anniversary achieves an amiable symbiosis with exhibitions by Taryn Simon, Isaac Julien and Juergen Teller. Each of them in their own way disrupts expectations.

For Magnum, David Hurn and Martin Parr have created a show based on the photographic collection that Hurn has built over six decades by exchanging his own images with those of other photographers. The show ranges from the iconic and familiar with rare finds from the Magnum archives.

Isaac Julien's artistic practice is firmly rooted in photography. He has worked simultaneously with photographers and cinematographers to create still and moving picture artworks. Working in collaboration with Victoria Miro Gallery we will present a series from his award winning *Looking for Langston*, a work that owes much to Julien's studies of the photographs of James Van der Zee, George Platt Lynes and Robert Mapplethorpe.

Like Isaac Julien this year's Photo London Master of Photography, Taryn Simon, is an artist who moves easily between various artistic disciplines. In her case: photography, text, sculpture and performance. Simon's practice involves extensive research. She creates projects guided by an interest in systems of categorisation and classification. We present a special exhibition of Simon's, centred on her *Image Atlas* work.


Completing the exhibition quartet is an exhibition produced in collaboration with Alison Jacques Gallery in which Juergen Teller presents work that crosses and re-crosses the borders between fine art and fashion.

This year's installation programme explores virtual reality—both as an artwork (Mat Collishaw) and as a museum (dslcollection)— as well as presenting a large scale external installation by William Klein, produced in collaboration with HackelBury Fine Art.

Each of our exhibiting artists has been invited to discuss their practice as part of our acclaimed talks programme. Curated for a second time by the distinguished author and curator William A. Ewing the programme features some thirty talks running across the five days of the Fair. Martin Parr, David Hurn, Isaac Julien, Mat Collishaw, Taryn Simon and Juergen Teller will be joined by a stellar cast of artists, dealers, collectors and curators including Penelope Umberico, Adam Fuss, Thaddeaus Ropac, Bruce Davidson, Thomas Demand, Roger Ballen, Kathy Ryan, Dan Holdsworth, Tom Hunter, Rut Blees Luxemburg and Gastón Ulgade.

And then when the talking is done and as the Fair waves its visitors goodbye, the legendary *Deadhouse Sessions* will spring rudely awake in the iconic subterranean caverns beneath the Courtyard. This year the *Sessions* will be produced in association with a global online music platform who will provide a truly eclectic mix of music and photography.

And so our dreams are done. And even as they fade we will start to dream again...

# Thresholds Mat Collishaw

Photo London 2017 will host a new installation by Mat Collishaw that restages the world's first ever exhibition of photography in virtual reality. Using the latest technology, Collishaw's work will offer visitors the closest thing to time travel by allowing them to feel physically present at an epoch defining moment in our cultural heritage.

To recreate the 1839 exhibition, the artist collaborated with a host of experts including VR specialists, architectural historians and world experts on photography to produce an experience that delivers multiple levels of reality. Through both a VR engine and an actual room with tangible objects, the physical experience will be synchronised with the VR visuals. The result is that visitors can walk freely and untethered around the exhibit, with the ability to touch displays and feel other sensations such as heat from a fireplace. The reverberations of the Chartist demonstrations of the period will be heard and glimpsed through the windows, drawing parallels between the social consequences of the industrial revolution and the potential ramifications of technological progress.

Collishaw's work has been exhibited in numerous solo shows around the world, including most recently: *The Centrifugal Soul*, Blain | Southern, London (2017); *folly! Fountains Relief*, Fountains Abbey & Studley Royal, Yorkshire (2016); *Mat Collishaw*, New Art Gallery Walsall (2015); *Black Mirror*, Galleria Borghese, Rome (2014). Collishaw's work is in numerous public and private collections including; Arter Foundation, Istanbul; British Council Collection, London; Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris; GAM, Torino; Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego; Museum of Old and New Art, New South Wales; Olbricht Collection, Berlin and Tate, London.

# A Short History of Slouching

'Lieutenant: I've been dodgin' fuckin' bullets since I was fourteen. No one can kill me. I'm blessed. I'm a fuckin' Catholic.'

Take Harvey Keitel's words, substitute bullets with pictures and you will have compressed all of Juergen Teller's vision into a pill.


'Once upon a time in a suburban neighbourhood of an irrelevant country, people did not eat frogs but kissed them and made love with them' This could be the beginning of a fairy tale written by Juergen Teller while taking pictures of frogs that will eventually turn into a small crowd of viewers slouching around.

Teller's gift is not just to tell with images a simple story but in fact is the ability to turn extraordinary people into normal people on the verge of a magic breakdown. Or to transform common people into remarkable ones staring into some kind of revelation. But no matter who they are Teller's characters share the same attitude toward life or maybe not really an attitude but a posture. They are not tired, they are not fatigued but possibly jaded or disillusioned looking like for them it's enough of another day. This state of mind could be seen as nihilist but it is not at all. It just reflects Teller's inner philosophy that we are all after all normal people, same issues, same problems, same desires beyond social or economic conventions. Teller is visually a nudist. Not because many of his subject are naked but because he undresses all of his subjects feelings. With his work, Teller achieves the rawness of Harvey Keitel in Bad Lieutenant.

Teller's world always plays with the relentless mutation and transformation of human outer and inner identity. In this exhibition roles and genders shift constantly between the animal worlds and human one through a revolving door of romantic states of mind. *Teller ga kaeru*. The artist will return or will turn into something else, maybe one of the frogs, another state of mind another physical dimension. Teller shows more and more the way his gaze is entangled with his own personal mythology a world where reality and storytelling become surrounded by a mist which erases boundaries and logic pulling the viewer in a light and deep state of wonder. But to the core of all of Teller's vision is one only thought 'You slouch ergo You are'.

# The Pavilion Commission: William Klein

A legendary figure in both photography and film, with a career spanning over half a century, William Klein first created and exhibited his Mural Projects in Milan in 1951. Originally conceived as large-scale architectural painted panels, in 1952 they inspired Klein's earliest experiments with photography. When first exhibited in Paris in 1953 they led directly to his invitation to work for Vogue in 1954. The rest, as they say, is history.

The first of this year's Pavilion Commissions will be a new and unique 18 metre long mural project by William Klein, made in association with HackelBury Fine Art.

# dslcollection: from iconic photography to virtual reality

dslcollection presents a multi-dimensional exhibition that creates a link between the past and the future. Alongside the collection's own virtual reality project is a seminal video work, from the collection, by Chen Chieh Jen, one of the most influential figures in the development of Taiwanese conceptual art. Taking its inspiration from Georges Bataille's famous 1905 photograph of a *lingchi* execution—literally death by a thousand cuts Chen's video work has strong historical references '*l* cannot stop gazing at these photographic images of anonymous people being tortured, executed. In the trance of gazing at photographic images *l* was often seeing myself to be a victim, or a persecutor, or a collaborator in the photographs'. Chen Chieh Jen.


In this 25-minute video, Chen sets the scene of the execution and mixes it with images of the ruins of historical places such as Beijing's Summer Palace, as well as contemporary images of female workers

in Taoyuan who are disabled by accidents or occupational hazards and no longer able to work.

As a counterpoint to the historical references in Chen's video, dslcollection presents the first virtual reality platform for a private art collection. As a pioneer in the use of technology in the art world, dslcollection's latest project allows the public to experience the collection via virtual reality.

The VR project was launched in Shanghai in mid-2016, followed by an exhibition in Paris in October 2016. Participants are able to navigate themselves around the virtual museum and interact with the artworks directly.

Chen's video and dslcollection's virtual reality let you escape to another world and create memorable experiences. That's fundamental because as Robert Motherwell said: '*Art is an experience, not an object*'.



# Image + Word

For the second year running, I have had the pleasure of curating the Photo London Talks Programme.

We like to say 'talks' rather than lectures, preferring lively, spontaneous discussion over formal presentations.

As a major international Fair, Photo London is rife with images old and new, together with new ideas, not to mention fresh opinions, emotions, arguments, and impassioned judgements. Dealers, curators, collectors, journalists, critics, teachers, students, photographers and the interested public—some well-informed, others discovering the world of photography for the first time, and some *rediscovering* iconic pictures they haven't seen for a long time—rub shoulders amidst a sea of images.

The experiences vary widely: for one visitor the work of a photographer might come as a revelation; for another, it's 'been there, done that'. Sometimes a visitor may carry away (literally or figuratively!) a single, mesmerising picture. Often we visitors find ourselves arguing vehemently with friends in front of a particular picture.

The Talks are meant to give more voice to these diverse thoughts, some well-developed, others in the making. *Where is photography going?* might well sum up our fundamental, underlying curiosity. The Talks are also an occasion for photographers to show pictures of particular importance to them, and new or recent work. Some will even show us something they've just begun, or not yet complete and still 'a work in progress'. And the Talks provide a window on photography of the past, strong work which has somehow slipped into the shadows.

The Talks have, with the exception of several panels, been set up as dialogues between photographers and specialists such as curators, journalists and the like. This allows for conversations to take unexpected directions, sometimes revealing aspects of work or a career taken for granted or previously overlooked.

Personally, I have always tried to resist too narrow readings of photography, having discovered time and again how great photographers and great work can drift out of the mainstream and be forgotten. The domain of art photography is always in flux as ideas creep in from the further reaches. That flux is not easy for even informed minds to grasp; the Talks often help.

And so we've taken a broad approach again this year. Among the topics addressed in our Talks—30 in all, with 60 speakers—are collecting, photojournalism and documentary photography, portraiture, fashion, architecture, virtual reality, the Latin American scene, what's happening in the art and photography schools and what we might expect from this generation of students. Among the photographers who will be speaking are masters, mid-career artists, and younger photographers.

We hope you'll join us for scintillating conversations, and if you wish to question anything you hear, we hope you'll feel free to intervene!

#### Taryn Simon: Master of Photography

From the beginning, Taryn Simon's work has been characterised by its ambition, complexity and often exhaustive preparation. Her project, *A Living Man Declared Dead and Other Chapters I–XVIII*, which was shown at Tate Modern in 2011, is indicative of her approach. Its gestation comprised four years in which she and her team traced eighteen bloodlines across the globe, mapping the relationships among chance, blood, and other components of fate. In that 4 year period, a cumulative total of approximately 68 days was spent making portraits of the subjects.

'The act of taking photographs is actually a very small part of the process.' Simon told me back then, 'I work with a small team. We collaborate with translators, fixers, fact checkers and deal with the logistics of setting up shoots in places where often times people do not have access to the internet or telephones.' Simon also described that project as 'easily the most difficult and demanding project I have done thus far.'

Last year, though, she unveiled *An Occupation of Loss* at the Park Avenue Armory in New York, a non-photographic performance-based installation, co-commissioned by ArtAngel, which involved the construction of eleven monumental concrete towers and the participation of thirty professional mourners from fifteen different countries. Even by Simon's standards, the preparatory process was torturous. In order to secure visas for the mourners, her team spent five years on the necessary paperwork, which included gathering affidavits and references from anthropologists and academics as well as making repeated applications on behalf of each performer to U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) and each local American embassy. By the time the installation opened, Simon had amassed a stack of official papers one-foot high.

Simon's obsessive preparation is central to her creative process, but also reflects the complex, multi-layered nature of her themes and subject matter. Her preoccupations are distinctly contemporary: ever-increasing state power, government and corporate secrecy, the sustained mood of public anxiety in a time of real and manufactured fear. In his introduction to her breakthrough book, *An American Index of the Hidden and Unfamiliar*, Salman Rushdie wrote: 'In a historical period in which many people are making such great efforts to conceal the truth from the mass of the people, an artist like Taryn Simon is an invaluable counter-force. Democracy needs visibility, accountability, light'

Taryn Simon was born and grew up in New York. She was drawn to photography as a child by her father and grandfather, both of whom were enthusiastic amateur photographers and data collectors. Her father worked for the US government and travelled extensively, while her grandfather built telescopes and possessed a scientist's obsession with what Simon calls 'the macro—stars, insects, animal and plant life.' Intriguingly, there is often a scientific thrust to Simon's work, both in her deep research and the systematic approach that underpins the presentation of projects like *A Living Man Declared Dead* and the earlier *Contraband*, a visual inventory of 1,075 items seized by US customs officers over a four-day period at New York's JFK Airport. (They included a deer penis, cow dung toothpaste, counterfeit pharmaceutical and luxury items and a dead bird alongside more banal banned substances like bananas, sausages, and plants.)

Simon studied semiotics at Brown University, while taking additional classes in photography at Rhode Island School of Design and, after graduating, worked as an assistant for various photographers in order to make a living and learn about lighting and technique.

Her first book, *The Innocents* (2003), was made with the aid of a Guggenheim grant. It comprises a series of portraits of victims of miscarriages of justice in America, many of which were made at the scenes of the crimes—locations to which her subjects had never been, but changed their lives forever. It is a starkly evocative book. It is also, revealingly, a subtle interrogation of the complex, often misleading, role of photography as evidence, from detailed forensic images to the use of mugshots of the accused in witness corroboration. Like her later work, *A Living Man Declared Dead*, it is about, as Simon puts it, 'people suddenly caught up in a narrative that is not their own.'

It was with the publication of *An American Index of the Hidden and Unfamiliar* in 2007 that Simon refined her distinctive conceptual terrain. The project merged deep research and a rigorous approach in the production of images that, as Simon Baker, Tate Modern's curator of photography, put it, were 'sophisticated in terms of contemporary art practice but also hard-wired to the real world.' In the process, she somehow gained access to determinedly secretive organisations including the Church of Scientology and the Prisoner of War Interrogation Resistance Programme run by Team Delta, a private body run by former US military personnel. The book revealed a secret America that seemed almost sci-fi in its otherness, from a photograph taken inside a cryopreservation unit where bodies are frozen just after death to another of a bio-containment laboratory where deadly animal diseases are studied. The end result was both coolly detached and disturbing. 'Somehow,' wrote Salman Rushdie, 'Simon has persuaded a good few denizens of hidden worlds not to scurry for shelter when the light is switched on, as cockroaches and vampires do, but to pose proudly for her invading lens.'

In 2015, Simon shifted her gaze to matters more metaphorical with her series, *Paperwork and the Will of Capital*, a work that merged photography and sculpture in another critique of contemporary state power. The historical context for the project is the United Nations Monetary and Financial Conference which took place in New Hampshire in 1944 and led to the establishment of the IMF and the World Bank. Simon limited her subesequent research to the 44 countries that signed this historic document addressing the globalization of economies after World War II. She identified archival photographs of signing ceremonies for political accords, contracts, treaties, and decrees. Simon's eye was drawn to the individual floral arrangements that had been created for each official signing ceremony. She worked with a botanist to identify the flowers in the photographs before shipping 4,000 plant specimens from the largest flower auction in the world, in the Netherlands to her New York studio, where variants of the original arrangements were meticulously recreated and photographed. Afterwards, the bouquets were preserved and mounted in concrete absurd and formally beautiful, symbolic remnants of what Simon calls 'the stagecraft of power'.


In a relatively short, but intensely productive, period—2003 until the present—Taryn Simon has established herself as an artist who is acutely attuned to the particular anxieties of our turbulent times. For her Masters exhibition at Photo London, for example, she will show *Image Atlas* (2012) a work that she created with programmer Aaron Swartz that interrogates the possibility of a universal visual language and investigates the cultural differences and similarities by indexing top image results for given search terms across local engines throughout the world. Visitors can refine or expand their comparisons from the 57 countries currently available, and sort by Gross Domestic Product (GDP) or alphabetical order. 'I don't have an agenda,' she told me in 2011. 'I guess a lot of what I do is underpinned by anxiety. But I am also anxious about photography and its role. I try to keep a clear distance from the subject. I never want to say that I understand or somehow know the subject. In fact, it's more that I don't know.'

One senses that the sheer monumentalism of *An Occupation of Loss* marks a break with the uses of photography as the central, defining element of her work. Taryn said recently to the Harvard-based post-colonial scholar, Homi K. Bhaba, 'I was considering how a photograph breaks time's continuum, and marks something that is gone and lost'...'I was thinking about that in the development of the architecture of *An Occupation of Loss*—the ways in which man marks the invisibility of loss physically, since Neanderthal times, and how scale plays into that conversation and corresponds to a certain level of grief, be it national, global, or individual.' *An Occupation of Loss*, which will be re-staged in an outdoor location in London by ArtAngel, is indeed a move away from photography towards an epic engagement with performance, sculpture, sound and architecture.


Whatever Taryn Simon's future direction, she has already reminded us, through her often slowly evolving and labour intensive projects, of photography's singular ability to show us the world anew in all its mystery and complexity.

### David Hurn's Swaps

On the occasion of the 70th anniversary of Magnum Photos, and to celebrate the community of photographers of which he is a part, Magnum's current President Martin Parr has curated a selection of the print swaps from which David Hurn has built an extraordinary collection.

With a career spanning over six decades, Hurn, like Parr, is also a connoisseur and patron of documentary photography. Over the years he has amassed more than 600 prints, from the nineteenth century to the present. This year, the entire collection will be gifted to the National Museum Wales, where in September an inaugural exhibition will mark the opening of the Museum's first permanent gallery dedicated to photography.

Parr's selection spans Bill Brandt through to Diana Markosian and begins with a group of images by colleagues, such as Sergio Larrain and Bruce Davidson, whose work was to influence Hurn's own practice. We then move into a playful presentation in which images have been paired or grouped into larger relationships around a key Hurn image.

The juxtapositions of these prints, which are by turn complimentary, surprising and surreal highlight Hurn's skill as a documentary photographer, his eclectic collectors eye and the diverse creative personalities of the community from which the work is drawn.

#### **Martin Parr**

David Hurn has produced a concept that is so deliciously simple, I wonder why more photographers haven't done it. He has built a collection of photographs by exchanging his own images with those of other photographers.

This exhibition highlights one section of his collection: the exchanges mainly with his Magnum colleagues. One of the first emails any new nominee will receive, on being accepted by Magnum, is from Hurn, inviting them to exchange. Everyone always willingly agrees; they select their favourite Hurn image and vice versa.

As will be evident from this exhibition, Hurn has accumulated a stunning collection of images. Some are iconic and familiar and some have not been seen before, being hidden away in the depths of the Magnum online archive. For the exhibition, many of Hurn's best known images kept coming up as the photographer's choice; we have arranged the display so his single images are surrounded by the selections from the people who have chosen it. Many visitors to this show will have already toured the rooms of Photo London. One common realisation from this is that good photography does not come cheap. Perhaps the most compelling aspect of this show is that the collection did not cost a penny to create, apart from the paper and ink that Hurn used in preparing his exchanges.

This collection offers two significant insights. Firstly, David Hurn is a very fine photographer indeed. Many of us are familiar with his iconic images such as the man with the balloon at a ball and remember the shoot with The Beatles that he did in the 60s. But do pay attention to the less familiar images that have been unearthed. They are equally good and many are shown in public for the first time. Secondly, it is very apparent that Hurn has a fine eye for photography. Every one of the images he has selected is a winner. The images range across the many genres of photography, across the broad spectrum of Magnum photographers.

Having witnessed how effective this simple idea can be, I am hoping and expecting that many more photographers will join the exchange system. If ever you want a compelling case for this idea you will find it in Hurn's collection in this exhibition.

#### **David Hurn**

Memory demands an image. Bertrand Russell.

In 1958, a chance encounter in Trafalgar Square affected my future life. I was photographing the pigeons. Another photographer, Sergio Larrain, was doing the same. We became close friends and he, later, gave me as a present, my first collectable prints.

Look at large bodies of work by the finest photographers and you quickly discover that it is easy to distinguish the individual styles and concerns. They look outward not inward. Life itself is the mirror in which the personal image is reflected.

Experience has informed me that photographers of all personality types are governed by certain basic principles: Photographers are not primarily interested in photography. They bring to their subject an exaggerated sense of curiosity, backed up by knowledge gleaned from reading, writing, talking, listening, note-taking. The photographer transmits this passion by making pictures, therefore the subject must lend itself to a visual medium, as opposed to writing about it: The photographer must assiduously practice his/her craft so that there is no technical impediment between realising the idea and transmitting it through the final print.


The photographer is, first and foremost, a selector of subjects. The photographer makes a conscious choice from the myriad of possible subjects in the world and states: I find this interesting, significant, beautiful or of value. The photographer walks through life pointing at people and objects; the aimed camera shouts 'look at that!' The photographer produces pictures in order that his or her interest in a subject can be communicated to others. Each time a viewer looks at a print, the photographer is saying 'l found this subject to be more interesting or significant than thousands of other objects I could have captured; I want you to appreciate it too'. I am interested in prints that reflect most of the above criteria. I have never chosen a print that has not enriched my life.

# Isaac Julien Looking for Langston

Looking for Langston is a film (1989) and photographic series (1989/2016) directed by Isaac Julien. It would become the hallmark of what R. Ruby Rich named New Queer Cinema. The film is also seen as a touchstone for African-American Studies and has been taught widely in North American art schools for nearly 30 years.

Looking for Langston is a poetic documentary and homage to Harlem Renaissance poet Langston Hughes. When Julien was preparing to make what would become this award-winning work, he studied the photographs of James Van der Zee, George Platt Lynes and Robert Mapplethorpe. His research led not only to a critical response to their work but the creation of a landmark in the exploration of desire and the reciprocity of the gaze. Looking for Langston was made when the AIDS crisis was at its height.

The photographic works exhibited alongside the film at Photo London are renderings of the visual components that might be missed in a fleeting filmic image. The images also document the making of the film, the staging, lighting, iconography and choreography. One can see a direct relation between these images imbued with references to the history of 1920s and 30s black and white photography. Throughout his career, Julien has worked simultaneously with photographers and cinematographers to make still and moving picture artworks. For Julien, the photographs act as 'memorial sites'. Sometimes they reveal facts behind his fictions and explore the creative process, at other times they zero in on a portrait or go deeper into a moment of contested history. Whatever the case, Julien is unapologetic about his pursuit of beauty. Visual pleasure is essential to his exploration of subaltern issues and so he often works with advanced pre- and post-production technologies to orchestrate what he calls an 'aesthetics of reparation'. Working with Nina Kellgren (cinematographer) and Sunil Gupta (photographer), Julien shot *Looking for Langston* in the 1980s in London but set it in the jazz world of 1920s Harlem. His use of low-key lighting and sculptural smoke further complicate historical periodization, infusing the work with a 1940s film noir feel. The imaginative combination of epochs creates a kind of 'creolization' of photographic forms as well as a potent and self-conscious timelessness.

The photographic works deploy an array of new and old technologies. The *Looking for Langston* photographs are presented both in their original form as silver gelatin works printed on Ilford paper and as large scale works mounted on Diasec where Julien has used both digital and analogue techniques to create an immersive, cinematic experience. In this way, Julien contests any fetishistic notion of the original and insists that the work of art can be open to re-articulation as the artist alters his engagement with an ever-shifting visual culture.






lsaac Julien *I Love My Friend* From *Looking for Langston*,1989
